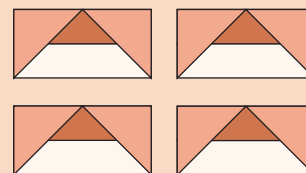




Capped Flying Geese Block

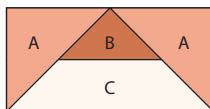

2" x 4" Finished

- All seams are 1/4"
- RST = right sides together

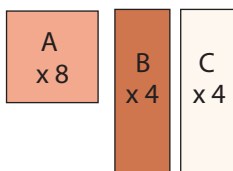


NOTE: There are TWO sets of instructions. Choose either exact or oversized & strip pieced.

EXACT Instructions

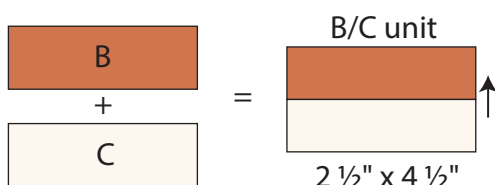
CUTTING

- A** (8) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares
- B** (4) 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles
- C** (4) 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

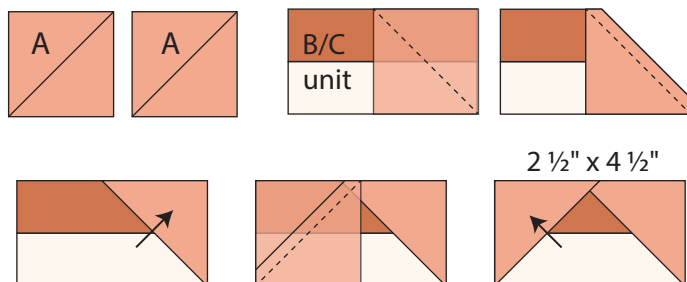


ASSEMBLY

- With RST, sew a B rectangle to a C rectangle.
- Press toward B.
- The B/C unit should measure 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".



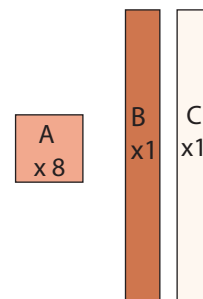
- On the wrong side of each A square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.
- With RST, align an A square onto the right side of a B/C unit.
- Stitch on the diagonal line.
- Trim seam allowance and press to the corner.
- Repeat with another A square on the opposite side of the B/C unit. It should measure 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".
- Repeat all steps to make four Capped Flying Geese blocks.



OVERSIZED & STRIP PIECED Instructions

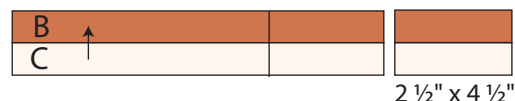
CUTTING

- A** (8) 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" squares
- B** (1) 1 1/2" x 19" strip
- C** (1) 1 1/2" x 19" strip

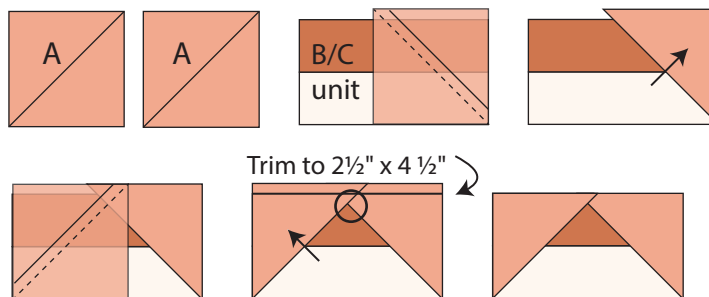


ASSEMBLY

- With RST, sew the B and C strips together.
- Press towards B.
- Cut the strip set into (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" B/C units.



- On the wrong side of each A square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.
- Place an A square RST on the right side of a B/C unit, aligning the **bottom and right edges**. The square will hang over the top of the B/C unit.
- Stitch on the diagonal line
- Trim seam allowance and press to the corner.
- Repeat that process with another A square on the opposite side of the B/C unit.



- Trim the top edge, making sure the seam allowance is 1/4" beyond the center point.
- Repeat to make four Capped Flying Geese blocks.
