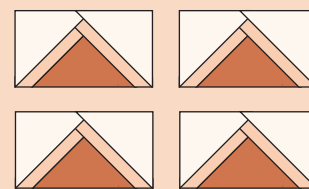




Stroked Flying Geese Block

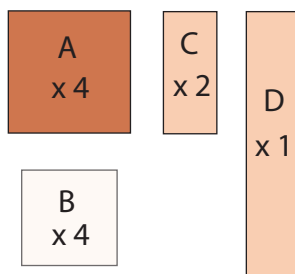

Cutting Instructions

- A** (4) 4" x 4" squares
- B** (4) 3 1/8" x 3 1/8" squares
- C** (2) 1 3/4" x 4" rectangles
- D** (1) 1 3/4" x 8 3/4" rectangle

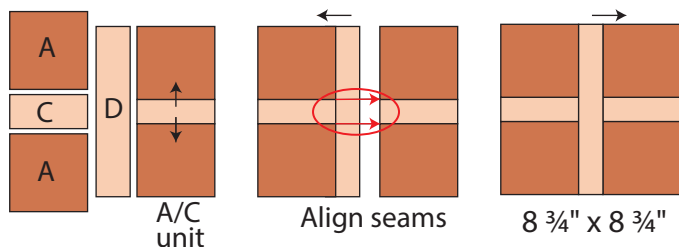


These Stroked Flying Geese have a clever piecing method developed by the team at Art Gallery Fabrics. They are made oversized and then trimmed to exact size.

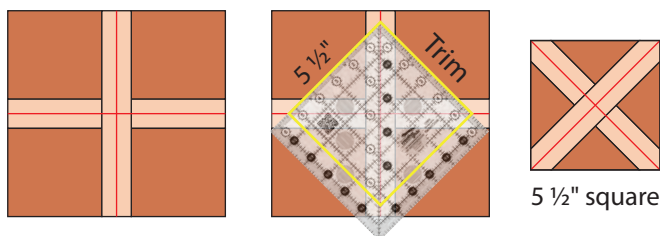
- Please read through all instructions before beginning.
- All seams are 1/4".
- Follow pressing arrows as indicated.
- RST = right sides together
- FG= flying geese

Assemble Large FG Body

- With RST, sew an A square to each long side of a C rectangle. Repeat to make (2) A/C units.
- Sew an A/C unit to one long side of the D rectangle.
- Before sewing on the second A/C unit, make sure the horizontal seams are aligned.
- Resulting square should measure 8 3/4" x 8 3/4".

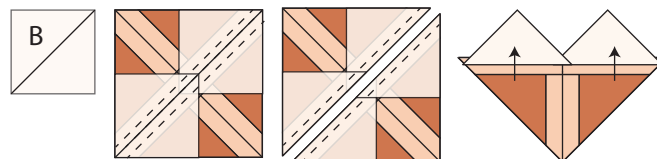


- On the right side of the pieced square, draw a horizontal and vertical line down the center.
- Mark the 5 1/2" lines on a square ruler with tape.
- Align the diagonal line of square ruler along the vertical center and the 5 1/2" lines with the horizontal center.
- Trim the top two sides.
- Rotate and trim the remaining two sides at 5 1/2".

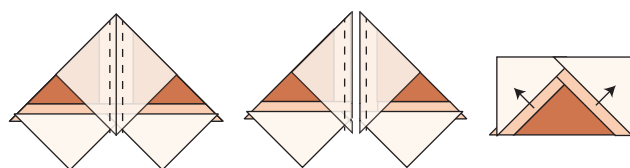


Make 4-at-a-time Flying Geese

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each B square.
- Place two B squares on opposite corners of the 5 1/2" pieced square. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line.
- Cut apart on the diagonal line and press.



- Place a B square on remaining corner of each unit from above. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line.
- Cut apart on the diagonal line and press.



- Trim each unit to 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- Makes four Stroked Flying Geese.
